

Rules and Regulations

Level 1	Grades 1, 2
Level 2	Grades 3, 4
Level 3	Grades 5, 6
Level 4	Grades 7, 8
Level 5	Grades 9, 10, 11

- Each level will have approximately 40 questions.
- 40 minutes will be allowed once the test starts.
- All the questions will be multiple choice with four choices A, B, C, D.
- Contestants will mark the answer in the Scranton sheet
- Proctor will announce the start, 5 minute warning before conclusion and the end of the testing process.
- Each question is 2 points; there are no negative points for getting it wrong.
- In case there is a tie, wrong answers are counted and the participant getting least number of wrong answers will be the winner.
- If there is a still a tie then the person who turned in the answer sheet first will be the winner.
- Contestants can turn in the completed answer sheets any time up until the last 5 minute warning is announced or on conclusion of the test.
- In case of further tie the blocks of 10 questions each from the beginning will be used to decide the winner
- Extra paper sheets stapled with the question paper will be provided for working.
- Calculators or any smart devices/phones are not allowed in the hall.
- Contestants are not allowed to use cheat sheets of any sort.
- Question and answer sheets will be kept by MEANT and not handed over to contestants.
- Sample questions sheets are not provided.
- MEANT will announce the first three winners in each category. Graded sheets will not be handed out.
- Final decision on all matters related to MEANT Math Olympiad will reside with MEANT BOD.
